## **Scholarships for Summer 2023**

Scholarship applications will be available beginning **February 1, 2023**, on our web site at **www.arrowbearmusicassoc.org/scholarships**. You can also contact our Scholarship Chairperson, Laura Kusaba, at 562-634-5158 or by email at **arrowbearmusicassociates@gmail.com** to request a paper application after February 1. Last summer we granted \$54,775 in scholarships to 52 recipients. Most scholarships awarded are partial scholarships. There are a limited number of full scholarships available. We grant scholarships to both choral and instrumental applicants. Recipients are chosen based on both need and merit. Nearly all of our recipients would not have been able to attend a summer music camp without financial assistance. Applications are due in mid-April. We notify all applicants by the middle of May. The process includes a written application, a recording of a solo with or without accompaniment on a CD or flash drive, a letter written by the applicant explaining why he or she needs a scholarship, and a recommendation letter from a private or school music teacher. **Please be sure of your summer plans before you apply for a scholarship. Once awarded, scholarships are not transferable to another session, music camp, or person. Recipients are expected to attend the entire session without arriving late or leaving early unless there is an emergency.**

#### **Coffee Time with Ross**

Hi, it's me again! It was great seeing so many of you at the Reunion in September. As I said in the first Coffee Time segment, I was asked to write a piece for each issue of the newsletter highlighting some of the unique aspects of the last 36 years of the camp program for those of us who were campers and staff during those times.

One of the things that always has made Arrowbear so unique is the way we blend the music making focus with the experience of a traditional summer camp with activities like crafts, ping pong, volleyball, group singing, and hiking. One staple of Coffee Time with Ross at Advanced Session (evening assembly) is a "recreation report" where campers can share highlights of their afternoon.

One of the differences in recreation the last 36 years is the expansion of the hikes we do. When I first camped in the early '80s, I remember there primarily being Happy Gap and a local spot called "New Inspiration Point" which was a small outcropping on the fire access road above camp. Thanks to Albert Jeung, and later Seth, Dennis and Carole's eldest son, we now have many more, and some longer, hiking destinations in and around camp. This was also catalyzed by the camp's acquisition in the early '90s of about 100 acres above camp that border the National Forest.

Some of the popular new destinations include "Devil's Pile," a slightly bigger and more vertical cousin of Happy Gap up the creek bed from camp; "Commando Rock," a very large granite outcropping across Keller Peak Road from Devil's Pile; and Mill Peak (a Sierra Club registered peak), which we refer to as "Seth's Peak," since he originally pioneered that hike, which he called "The Hike to the Edge of the Mountain" before campers named it after him. There are others like some hikes that end up on the ridge above camp, and Larke, the current custodian of camp hike culture, has begun forays to a large rocky area up Keller Peak Road she has named "Albert's Rocks" in honor of his legacy. We have even occasionally had full day hikes all the way up to the fire lookout station at Keller Peak!

So, enjoyment of the outdoors is alive and well at Arrowbear even for the iPhone generation, and we still end our days around a fire in the dark and get together to sing in the evenings at "Coffee Time."

Are you part of the post-'85 generations? Do you have any special hiking memories? What would you like to see me write about in this space? I'd love to hear from you and hear what your special memories from camp are.
